- 1. All animals brought to NDVH are healthy, clean and well groomed.
- 2. All inoculations and examinations required for the species are updated annually and are evidenced by current Veterinarians records; copies of these records are to be provided by the owner / handler.
- 3. Animals need to be free of communicable disease and external parasites and be on a flea-control program.
- 4. Owner / handler bringing animal has to remain with animal during entire visit.
- 5. If the animal vomits, urinates or defecates, the owner stops the visit and is responsible for cleaning the area. The owner / handler are then responsible for notifying unit staff for further clean-up. Gloves, towels and plastic bags are available.
- 6. If an animal shows any type of aggression, the visit is immediately stopped and the animal will no longer be allowed to visit NDVH. If an animal harms or could harm a Veteran, employee or visitor (bites, scratches, and uneven temperament) that animal needs to leave the premises.
- 7. Bites and scratches need to be treated promptly and documented in accordance with the facility policy.
- 8. Animals are restricted from the dining room area. Animals are also restricted from other areas (such as Town Hall) when food is being served.
- 9. Animals are restricted from medication and treatment rooms.
- 10. Visiting animals have to be on a leash or in a clean carrier during visitation.
- 11. The NDVH will not be held liable for any injuries or costs resulting from injuries caused by the animal.
